Minutes of the workshop meeting held on March 8, 2022

A workshop meeting of the Lower Paxton Township Board of Supervisors was called to order at 7:12 P.M. by Chairman Henry on the above date at the Lower Paxton Township Municipal Center located at 425 Prince Street, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.

Board members present in addition to Mr. Henry were Robin Lindsey, Norman Zoumas, Chris Judd, and Paul W. Navarro. Also in attendance were Bradley N. Gotshall, Township Manager, R. Samuel Miller, Assistant Township Manager, and Steve Stine, Township Solicitor.

Pledge of Allegiance

Mr. Henry led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Announcement

Mr. Henry announced that the Supervisors met before the meeting in executive session, and they would meet again afterward.

Public Comment

There was none.

Presentation by Declan Fledderjohn on his Recently Completed Eagle Scout Project

Declan Fledderjohn of Boy scout Troop 302, Calvary United Methodist Church, announced that he recently completed his Eagle Scout Project. Mr. Fledderjohn created and led a team of scouts from his troop to install 13 AAC boards at five parks in the Township: Koons, Kohl, Brightbill, Centennial Acres, and George Park. Additionally, they cleaned and repainted Possibility Place at George Park.

Mr. Fledderjohn thanked the Parks & Recreation Board for their support and recognition.

Chairman Henry congratulated Declan Fledderjohn, his parents, grandparents, Scout Leader, and Troop 302 for everything they accomplished and contributed to the Township's Park system.

Mrs. Lindsey added that she had been in contact with Declan and asked him to participate in the PSATS Youth Contest and he said, "After I complete my Eagle Scout project." She mentioned that Declan decided to join in the PSATS Youth Contest, and the Dauphin County Association of Township Officials is going to sponsor him in the contest.

First Presentation of Resolution Providing for the Proper Administration of
Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (ARPA)

Samuel Miller presented a prelude of two Resolutions related to Corona Virus funds (ARPA), that would be presented to the Supervisors at their next business meeting. The first Resolution establishes that under the final ACT that the PA Treasury Department passed; those Municipalities that received 10 million dollars or less or over 10 million dollars and want to designate the funds could make a simple election that would allow them to earmark the funds for revenue loss provisions. This would simplify the process of utilizing the funds. Most entities that have received less than 10 million dollars will make this election to ease the administrative burden of the process. The second Resolution is related to a budgetary amendment to verify that the Township has received half of the ARPA funds and will receive the other half in July 2022, which will total 5.2 million dollars. This Resolution will allocate the funds to be used for governmental services, specifically for Public Safety personnel and related costs. This will allow the Township to free the funds from the budgetary provisions, in this year's Budget and later reallocate the funds to Capital Improvement Projects.

Mr. Henry directed Mr. Gotshall to advance the Resolutions to the following Business meeting agenda.


There were none.
