Lower Paxton Township Supervisor Norman Zoumas announces plans to resign from board at year's end

***Residents looking to fill the seat can send a letter of interest
to the township***

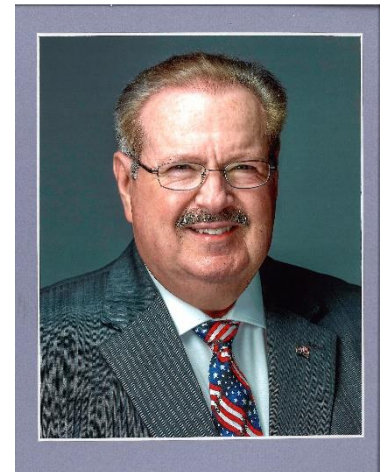
LOWER PAXTON TOWNSHIP, PA (Nov. 22, 2024) – Lower Paxton Township Supervisor Vice Chairman Norman C. Zoumas said he plans to resign from the five-member board on Dec. 31.

Zoumas, who was initially appointed in August 2018 to fill a vacancy and then won the seat in the 2019 election, will also resign as a member of the Township's Authority.

"It has been my distinct honor and pleasure to serve the public throughout my career, beginning first with the United States Army and Pennsylvania National Guard, moving to the Pennsylvania House of Representatives, and finally concluding my time here, serving the residents of Lower Paxton Township," Zoumas said.

"Throughout my career, I have also served on a number of volunteer boards and committees, whereupon I look favorably to serving into the future," he said.

Zoumas served 24 years in the Army and state National Guard, retiring as a lieutenant colonel. He worked for over 20 years as the Director of Fixed Operations for Hoffman



Ford and for five years on the staff of former state Rep. Ron Marsico, where he worked with constituents, veterans, and businesses.

Other supervisors joined Board Chairman Robin Lindsey in thanking Zoumas for his service.

"On behalf of the board, I want to express our gratitude to Norm Zoumas for his service and dedication to our community," Lindsey said. "Your countless contributions have made a lasting impact on our Township, and we wish you all the best in your future endeavors."

Those interested in serving must be a registered elector of the township and have resided in the township continuously for at least a one-year period prior to January 30, 2025. Appointees looking to remain on the board will have to run in 2025 for a two-year term and then in 2027 for the full six-year term.
